As mentioned last year, the board transitioned to a committee structure that was highly effective. All the committee leaders and teams were fully engaged. This has helped promote more participation and ownership. Along with electing officers, we will also assign committee ownership in the January board meeting. Added Signage to slopes – In an effort to prevent soil erosion, the board is asking that we keep wheeled vehicles off the park area slopes. Today's high powered 4 x 4's are damaging the slopes causing soil erosion and damage to the park areas. Please be considerate of others in using SVE park property.

Riverside Park – clean-up from the storm damage in 2018 was finalized along with improving the road shoulder adjacent to the park. The park is looking good again!

More improvements are being considered for 2021. Please share any ideas you might have on improving our community for the coming year. All ideas are welcome.

During the October annual meeting, the board decided to begin the process of updating the governing documents. This will be a major and necessary undertaking for 2021.
